VALE 126453/16686 Corporal Gordon Donald HASTIE

On 29 June this year, we lost a larger than life personality in Gordon Hastie. Although he started his Army career as a foot soldier in the CMF 1st Battalion, the Royal Queensland Regiment; after joining the Regular Army on 5 March 1962 and following recruit training he found himself in 1st Forward Delivery Troop, RAAC. Subsequently after Corps Training he was posted to B Squadron, 1st Armoured Regiment in Kapyong Barracks, Puckapunyal. Although he spent only two and a half years in armour before Corps transferring to RA Sigs, he always remembered that time with great fondness. He spent almost a year in Sth Vietnam with 506 and 709 Signal Troops from 17 May 1966 to 12 May 1967. Following discharge from the ARA in March 1968, he soldiered on in the Emergency Reserve until March 1974.

Thereafter followed a highly successful career in the private sector including 12 years as a regional director with Gerber Technology, managing its international operations in the US, Turkey and Singapore. More recently he ran his own software solutions company.

Gordon was a leading light in the Rotary Club of Southern Mitchell. He was a member of their executive and as youth chair he ensured that youth programs progressed substantially over recent years. He was a passionate contributor to the Mitchell Suicide Prevention Network. He was President of the Broadford RSL for four years during a very difficult period of rebuilding the clubrooms that had been destroyed by fire in January 2008. His senior executive experience and extraordinary business skills really came to the fore at that time. Our deepest sympathy goes out to his widow Evie and the Hastie family.

This Vale from long serving member Allen 'Shorty' Tanner:

VICTOR JOHN HALL was born 16th June 1935 - died 10th July 2020.

Another old soldier marches on, as he said in the song he wrote "Where are you, Armoured Soldier?" This song has been played at many funerals of old soldiers, leaving many with tears in their eyes.

Vic spent 9 years in the Army. He was a "Tankie" and proud of it. He did his National Service in 1953, then enlisted in the Regular Army 12th January 1954, serving in the Armoured Corps until 12th January 1963. He spent a great deal of that time in Puckapunyal and some at Wacol, Qld. He served in several capacities such as National Service trainer and Tank Commander. He only reached the rank of Corporal although serving as acting Sergeant in the last part of his service. He had decided that if they had not made him Sergeant when his time was up he wasn't re-enlisting. They didn't, so he left!

In 1959 Vic spent the year at the Point Cook School of Languages where he completed the Mandarin Chinese course successfully. He should have had a posting as an interpreter to Hong Kong for two years but was asked to forego that on compassionate grounds to enable the incumbent interpreter to remain there because of marriage problems with a Chinese wife. Being Vic, he said yes and went back to his unit and never used the new skill.


Vic married me, Colleen on 5th June 1965 and remained married until his death. 55 years of detected and forgiven sins, according to Vic. He leaves his wife Colleen, son Andrew and two daughters, Catherine and Rebecca, 4 grandsons and 2 granddaughters. When his mates were going to Vietnam he wanted to re-enlist but refrained because of our marriage.

Vic was a storyteller. He told some wild stories about things he got up to in the army with his mates. These were sometimes unbelievable but when some old army buddy turned up to visit, or there was a gathering of them, listening to them repeat the same stories was certainly an eye-opener. They were true!! He made it to the 1992 reunion in Pucka and performed in the concert for the old fellas. He really enjoyed doing that and meeting up with old friends.

Vic was involved in music his whole life. He has had bands or did solo performances over the years. He wrote many songs including Gospel songs and recorded them. He had a great faith in his Heavenly Father and has now gone to live with Him. There were two occasions where he was given the opportunity to make it in the music industry in Australia including on television, but because it would have affected his family or other band members adversely, he declined the opportunities. Typically Vic. He considered others before himself and was a great mate to his friends.

Vic suffered a massive stroke almost 6 years ago which left him paralysed down his right side, unable to play music or sing any more. That was the hardest thing for him. After 2 years being looked after by me at home, it just got too hard and Vic went into a nursing home where he remained until he had another massive bleed which ended his life. He was ready to go and therefore we cannot be sad about it. I just thank God for the wonderful years we had together.

NOTE: You need to be financial to vote. The financial year begins on 1 January and fees for the year are due from that date. Many members have already paid but if you are in doubt, please contact the secretary to confirm your financial status. Payment details are on the website.

RAACA SCHOLARSHIPS

One of the benefits your Association provides are the scholarships available to eligible children commencing or completing their Secondary education. Applicants must be the children of a financial member; unfortunately due to financial constraints, grandchildren are not eligible for either scholarship at this time.

The Victorian Branch Scholarship is currently \$150:00 per year for the first two years of secondary school. Applications should be forwarded to the Secretary with proof of attendance by 28 February in the first year of qualification. A follow up application is required for the second year. You must have been a financial member of the RAACA for a minimum of five years to apply.

The Brigadier F.B. Hinton, MC Scholarship which was a Federal Executive Scholarship is also administered by the Victorian Branch and currently provides \$500:00 for each of the final two years of Secondary School. Application including proof of intent to complete years 11 and 12 to our Secretary by 30 September in the applicant's year 10.

There are no scholastic results required, however proof of attendance must be provided on the relevant School's letterhead paper. **Applicants must be financial members**.
