# **Another RAAC Icon Laid to Rest**

The life of John Alexander (Jack) Carter, OAM, DCM was celebrated at the Benalla Lakeside Community Centre on a very wet Friday, 29th January 2021. The Community Centre was packed with family, friends and former comrades, some who travelled great distances in atrocious weather to pay their respects to a fine soldier whose exploits, particularly at the Battle of Long Tan are well known to his former RAAC colleagues. The citation for his Distinguished Conduct Medal is reprinted on page two.

### VALE 38317 WO1 John Alexander Carter, OAM, DCM 23 May 1945 – 23 January 2021

At approximately 1800 hours 18 August 1966, Corporal John Carter was the Crew Commander of an armoured personnel carrier of 3 Troop, First Armoured Personnel Carrier Squadron. This Troop had been given the task of carrying a relieving force of Infantry to assist D Company, 6 Battalion Royal Australian Regiment which was in heavy contact with a brigade sized enemy force. Orders were for the carrier troop to advance with two sections forward. Weather conditions at the time were extremely difficult due to a severe rain storm. When contact was made with the enemy, Corporal Carter's vehicle was engaged by fire from a 57mm recoilless rifle, machine gun and small arms fire. The projectile from the 57mm recoilless rifle missed his vehicle and exploded against a rubber tree. Corporal Carter returned fire using his .50 calibre machine gun. The gun jammed. He then grasped the driver's Owen Machine Carbine and without hesitation leapt onto the top of his vehicle and returned fire killing the 57 mm recoilless rifle team, a fraction after another 57 mm recoilless rifle round had been fired. This round exploded and dazed the crew and passengers. Corporal Carter still undeterred continued to fire killing five other enemy. By his actions Corporal Carter also drew attention to himself enabling the other vehicles of the troop to advance.

Through the action which was fought at a very close range, Corporal Carter showed outstanding courage, initiative and determination. His actions were an inspiration to all his comrades and contributed greatly to the success of the assault by the relief force, the heavy casualties inflicted on the enemy and immediately afterwards, the relief of D Company, 6th Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment.

John continued his military service and attained the rank of WO1. During his service in Defence, John was also awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for his outstanding contribution to the success of the 1988 Military Tattoo. I am sure that all Vietnam veterans especially those close friends of John will be saddened by his passing. John had been living in a retirement unit in Benalla for the past few years and had gradually been affected by dementia and PTSD. To daughter Jodie, son Glenn, siblings, sisters Bev, Jeanette and Gail, brother Daryl (deceased), family and friends of John may we pass on our deepest sympathies and sincerest condolences on this sad occasion of the passing of John.

John was a true warrior in any sense of the word yet suffered the effects of the Vietnam War for many years. He always felt that the Armoured Corps efforts at the Battle of Long Tan had not been fully recognised and this troubled him greatly. John is now Resting in Peace and will be sadly missed by us all. *Rick Ryan.*

# **Secretary's Report**

Members,

With 2020 behind us and our 75th year ahead, we can only hope that 2021 is an improvement on the past year. Having said that, we started 2020 well with great attendance at the Birthday Commemoration Service and the AGM but soon after, it became a progression of cancelled events. Despite all we were up against, we still managed to keep the administration of the Association ticking over throughout the year so we could keep everyone informed and, although somewhat tentative, be ready to start 2021 running.

Some of our achievements from 2020 include:

- **Our numbers have held fairly steady:** As RAACA (Vic) reaches 75, it's not unexpected that we saw another year with some of the old and bold passing on, but unfortunately getting together to recognise their passing was often difficult. Still, our numbers have held fairly well due to the recruitment of new members due largely to the work of David Finlayson, always on the lookout. It appears, some have also managed to find us through the website. This meant we ended the year with 203 members, five up from the previous year.
- **Communications:** Work has continued during the year, consolidating contact details and getting more members onboard with receiving Track by e-mail which has kept the production and distribution cost down. The website and setting up some dedicated e-mail addresses also helps.

## **Treasurer's Report**

As Treasurer I tender this document to the Membership and the Annual General Meeting, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Secretary Mr. Peter AXTON and the Auditor Mr. Roy ARNOTT.

The following information is to explain some of the more significant points from the accounts:

- The old Defence Bank account is now closed and all payments are now being made into the Bendigo Account. Most members are now making payments electronically and a few members are making payments by Cheque and Money Transfer Orders.
- Part of the banking changes involved a change in investment strategy, meaning an increase in bank interest received. However interest rates in the 2020 year have been less than 2019 due to lower interest rates across the financial sector
- Membership subscriptions for the year 2020 resulted in almost all members again being financial with six members not responding to reminders.
- Due to Covid19 restrictions Cambrai Dinner was not conducted in the Year 2020. This was reflected in the accounts as a positive as it usually runs at a loss. However, this loss is offset by the funds raised from the Cambrai Dinner Raffle. The Association would like to thank the generous donations of highly sought after raffle prizes and the generous raffle ticket purchases.
- An increase in our administration costs in the year 2020 is attributed to the printing cost for Track and associated postage.
- The reorganisation of the accounts in 2018 2019 highlighted the difficulty in tracking income and expenditure of donations intended for welfare. Steps were taken to overcome this and are now reflected in the accounts where the welfare income is equal to the welfare expenditure, the difference having been transferred to a Welfare Fund where it is available in future years.
- On the subject of welfare, the generosity of some of our members allows our Family Liaison Officer to continue the program of helping members and lifting spirits through the Easter and Christmas picnics, the Christmas hampers and assistance during the Covid19 period.
